

GoodNaz Community in Action Project: Thursday Sep 16 to Saturday Sep 18, 2021 (Dates are dependent on delivery of new trusses.) Lodging and meals will be at the campground. Partial participation is encouraged for those who cannot be there for the entire time.

Our Camp Garner Creek Restoration Project consists of two parts: Pavilion Restoration and Playground Restoration.

Part One is to stabilize and repair the Dining Pavilion. Forty feet of this important 100 foot long by 28 foot wide building was completely swept away by the flood. Our task will be to stabilize the remaining building first and then to rebuild the missing 40 foot section. We need two or three lead carpenters (with some experience), one lead electrician. We also need a number of helpers for carpentry and one helper for electrical. Licenses are not required and experience is not required to be a helper. Teens may participate with parental permission.

Tasks which are a part of the **Pavilion Restoration**:

1. Set (8) 6"x6"x10' pressure treated posts
2. Repair the existing beams and add both sides; 40' beams, made of (3) 2"x10"s bolted together.
3. Set (17) common trusses on 2' centers and 1 Gable end truss all with cross-bracing.
4. Install 4'x8' x5/8" OSB sheets, 30# felt paper and 3' wide by 16' long Roofing Metal
5. Install 80' of 1"x6" fascia board
6. Add hurricane clips to all trusses
7. Build 110' of benches around perimeter to replace those swept away.
8. Stabilize and repair existing remaining benches as needed.
9. Replace about 120 feet of electrical conduit and (8) overhead lights.
10. R & R Existing remaining electrical receptacles and switches.

Part two is to clean up the large amount of river mud that was deposited inside the ***George and Irene Pitzer Memorial Children's Playground***. This will require flat shovels and wheelbarrows and time. The mud is about 3 to 4 inches thick over the entire playground and must be removed before new safety ground cover can be installed. We need four or more workers who are able to shovel and wheelbarrow. Teens may enjoy participating here.
